

# Quicken Essentials and Quicken Mac 2015 Conversion Instructions

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*Quicken Essentials and Quicken Mac 2015*

*Web Connect to Express Web Connect*

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## Introduction

As American Federal Bank *completes its system conversion to a new online banking system, you will need to modify your Quicken settings to ensure the smooth transition of your data. To complete these instructions, you will need your Login ID and Password for American Federal Bank online banking website.*

*It is important that you perform the following instructions exactly as described and in the order presented. If you do not, your service may stop functioning properly. This conversion should take 15–30 minutes.*

**NOTE:** This update is time sensitive and can be completed on or after  
**05/12/2015**

## Documentation and Procedures

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### Task 1: Conversion Preparation

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1. Backup your data file. For instructions to back up your data file, choose **Help > Search**. Search for **Backing Up**, select **Backing up data files**, and follow the instructions.
2. Download the latest Quicken Update. For instructions to download an update, choose **Help > Search**. Search for **Updates**, select "Check for Updates," and follow the instructions.

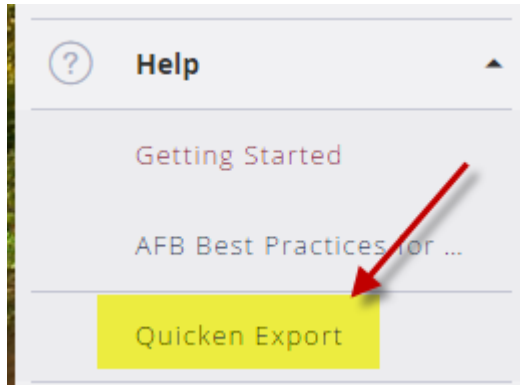
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### Task 2: Connect to American Federal Bank

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1. Select your account under the **Accounts** list on the left side.
2. Choose **Accounts > Update Selected Online Account**.
3. Enter **American Federal Bank** in the Search field and click **Continue**.

4. Log in to the American Federal Bank online banking web site at [www.americanfederal.com](http://www.americanfederal.com). To create the Quicken export file, follow the Quicken Export instructions located in the Help menu.



5. **Download** a file of your transactions to your computer.

**IMPORTANT:** Take note of the date you last had a successful connection. If you have overlapping dates in the web-connect process, you may end up with duplicate transactions.

6. Drag and drop the downloaded file into the box **Drop download file**.

**NOTE:** Select "Web Connect" for the "Connection Type" if prompted.

7. In the "Accounts Found" screen, ensure you associate each new account to the appropriate account already listed in Quicken. Under the **Action** column, select "**Link**" to pick your existing account.

**IMPORTANT:** Do **NOT** select "**ADD**" under the action column.

8. Click **Continue**.

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### **Task 3: Deactivate Your Account(s) At American Federal Bank**

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1. Select your account under the **Accounts** list on the left side.
2. Choose **Accounts > Settings**.
3. Remove the checkmark from **I want to download transactions**.
4. Click **Save**.
5. Click **Continue** when asked to confirm this deactivation.
6. Repeat steps 2 – 5 for each account at American Federal Bank.

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#### **Task 4: Re-activate Your Account(s) at American Federal Bank**

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1. Select your account under the **Accounts** list on the left side.
2. Choose **Accounts > Update Selected Online Account**.
3. Check the box **I want to download transactions** and click **Assist me**.
4. Enter **American Federal Bank** in the Search field and click **Continue**.
5. Type your **User Id** and **Password** and click **Continue**.
6. If the bank requires extra information, enter it to continue.

**NOTE:** Select "Quicken Connect" for the "Connection Type" if prompted.

7. In the "Accounts Found" screen, ensure you associate each new account to the appropriate account already listed in Quicken. Under the **Action** column, select "**Link**" to pick your existing account.

**IMPORTANT:** Do **NOT** select "**ADD**" under the action column.

8. Repeat step 7 for each additional account you wish to download into Quicken.
9. Click **Continue**.
